I founded LanguageBird in 2015 to offer high school students access to more diverse options for language courses. By taking advantage of the newest technological advancements, LanguageBird revolutionized language education with students participating in live, online, one-to-one language courses with native-speaking instructors. This has allowed students to learn at their own pace with instruction tailored to their learning style. It also prepares students for an increasingly globalized world by gaining an understanding and appreciation of other cultures, languages, and people.

As a firm believer in centering learning around students' needs, interests, and learning styles, I created the first accredited global language school to teach 100% live, online via video chat. Developing an adaptable, practical, and project-based curriculum to fit my vision for LanguageBird was the first step. Then, our teachers were hand-picked and trained to use the curriculum for personalized instruction to involve students directly, foster creative thinking, and allow the incorporation of their interests into their learning.

### **About LanguageBird**

All of our lessons are taught by connecting students to fascinating people from around the world. Students have flexibility in their schedules and can earn high school or middle school credit from wherever they are. We offer very beginner to the most advanced levels of language study. Students connect globally and engage in cultural studies with a native speaker, which increases their digital citizenship skills and offers the opportunity to practice speaking comfortably, fluidly, and confidently.

Many LanguageBird students are earning high school or middle school credit, but LanguageBird also works with any student aged 13 and older. Due to the one-to-one format, courses can be tailored to student needs at any age and language ability.



### **Learning Outcomes**

#### HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The High School Program is designed to help students develop communicative skills and to prepare them for further study in the language. Lessons are college-preparatory and academically rigorous, covering a full year's worth of material in 24 lessons. The Middle School Program prepares students to seamlessly continue their language learning in high school and cover one year of middle school courses in 24 lessons. The goal is to equip students to function in a culture that speaks the language of study; use the language in meaningful contexts for personal enjoyment, enrichment, and potential future travel; and appreciate the role of the language and culture in a global context through regularly conversing with a native speaker.

#### Students are expected to:

- 1. Listen to the language spoken by a native speaker to gain phonemic awareness.
- 2. Practice listening, speaking, reading, and writing in the language.
- 3. Develop the ability to communicate and express themselves in the language.
- 4. Gain awareness of cultures, customs, and viewpoints through interaction with a native speaker.
- 5. Increase their awareness of the internet as a tool and an informational and educational resource to connect with people around the world and discover new cultural knowledge.
- 6. In addition to the required one-to-one hours with the instructor, students are expected to demonstrate weekly progress through assignments completed independently.



### One-to-One Teaching

#### CUSTOMIZE YOUR LESSONS TO YOUR INTERESTS, STRENGTHS, AND LEARNING STYLE

At LanguageBird, we know that the best way to learn is through a one-to-one tailored format. Instructors design lessons to accommodate students' interests and learning styles, and teach at a pace that is comfortable yet challenges each student. We firmly believe there is no better or faster way to learn than private lessons with an expert instructor.

When students were asked what aspects of the LanguageBird teaching philosophy they liked most, 73% of students indicated the one-to-one teaching format was one of the things that they liked most, and 70% indicated the tailored lessons.

For students who deal with anxiety learning and then speaking a new language, this one-to-one model provides them a safe, supportive environment where they can practice and make mistakes. In fact, when students were asked what aspects of the LanguageBird teaching philosophy they liked most, 66% of students indicated that because of the LanguageBird teaching philosophy, they did not feel stressed or anxious during the lessons. Not all students deal with stress and anxiety in language learning, but for those who do, the LanguageBird way can help them navigate those issues.

Parents also saw the benefits of this approach. 97% of parents reported that the instructor supported their students in their education and described them as amazing, wonderful, excellent, or great.

### More on One-to-One Instruction



I used to enjoy group dynamics in a classroom setting, but since I joined LanguageBird, I LOVE teaching Japanese in a one-to-one environment because I can do so much more and make my lessons more personalized based on each student's interests, needs, and pace! I can pay very close attention to their strengths and weaknesses, and students feel more comfortable and relaxed speaking and learning the Japanese language. I have been teaching English and Spanish as a second language for about 14 years now. I have taught in both a traditional classroom and personalized one-to-one instruction. From experience, I would have to say that the latter has proven to be the most beneficial for my students. First of all, you cannot help yourself but tailor each lesson to each student's needs and interests. This becomes one of the greatest motivations for the student to actually learn their chosen second language. Incorporating each student's interests in lessons is not something that can be done in a classroom full of students, which is why in a traditional classroom we don't get the chance to spark every student's interest in learning the language.

To me, one-to-one instruction is a very rewarding experience for both the teacher and the student. As a teacher, I get to challenge myself to use my creativity to make the lesson as engaging and fun as possible, and the student gets the opportunity to increase their language skills with a native-speaking teacher without having to worry about others in the class.


### Student-Teacher Relationships

#### A RELATIONSHIP-BASED APPROACH TO ONLINE LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION


Traditional language classrooms do not work for every student as teachers must attend to 25+ students and cannot differentiate instruction to each student. At LanguageBird, students learn one-to-one with an expert instructor who will design lessons to accommodate students' interests and learning styles, and they will teach at a pace that is comfortable yet challenges each student.

### **Building Digital Literacy Skills**

#### LANGUAGEBIRD BELIEVES IN COMMUNICATION BETWEEN PEOPLE, NOT ROBOTS OR SOFTWARE

In our increasingly connected world, digital literacy skills are important to prepare students for their future education and career. Because all instruction and materials are online, LanguageBird students build digital literacy skills alongside their language skills.

We primarily use Microsoft Teams because students and instructors can meet, chat, and share homework and resources easily and effectively, but also because Microsoft Teams also allows instructors to record lessons so students can re-watch and review materials after class.

Additionally, students utilize other programs to access additional materials prepared and shared by their instructors. Students learn to download materials, log into programs, navigate across platforms, send chat messages, and write thoughtful emails.

Through connection with people, students learn to navigate technology and build digital literacy.

### Language and Culture

#### LANGUAGE AND CULTURE WITHOUT PACKING A BAG!

At the core of our mission is creating a community of learners who master speaking new languages with confidence, and who engage with instructors for self-paced language learning and cultural discovery. By working one-to-one with skilled instructors who are native speakers of the language and culture, students build their global citizenship and cultural literacy in a way that they cannot in the traditional classroom.


### Language Learning Attitudes

#### LEARN LANGUAGE USING METHODS THAT INSPIRE


At LanguageBird, we see students who excel, struggle, and are neutral toward language learning. Our instructors meet students where ever they are in their language learning journey, encouraging them to continue learning or helping them find the motivations to learn and hopefully to ultimately find language learning rewarding and a skill they can take with them into their future education and profession.

Before working with LanguageBird only 48.3% of students had a positive or very positive language learning attitude, 35.2% had a neutral attitude, and 16.5% had a negative or very negative attitude. However after working with LanguageBird 94.7% of students had a positive or very positive language learning attitude while only 4.4% had a neutral attitude and 0.9% had a negative attitude.

#### After Studying with LanguageBird




Furthermore, when comparing student attitudes toward language learning before and after working with LanguageBird, we see that 94% of students had a positive change in attitude toward language learning after studying with LanguageBird or maintained a positive attitude toward language learning.

Parents also saw the same results in their students. They said that before working with LanguageBird 63.1% of parents felt their student had a positive or very positive language learning attitude, 31.6% felt their student had a neutral attitude, and 5.3% felt their student had a negative or very negative attitude. However, after working with LanguageBird 94.7% of parents felt their student had a positive or very positive language learning attitude while only 5.3% felt their student had a neutral attitude and 0% felt their student had a negative attitude.

Additionally, 94.7% of parents reported that their student had a positive change in attitude toward language learning after studying with LanguageBird or maintained a positive attitude toward language learning.


### **Academic Confidence**

To promote a more authentic or real-world use of language, students are taught with a focus on learning and using language in context. For example, grammatical topics introduced to students are taught and used in authentic or real-world situations. This approach ensures that students are doing more than memorizing grammar points; it presents students with a variety of opportunities to engage in communicative tasks and gain confidence in the grammar and culture of the language they are studying.

# Textbook Independent and Project-Based Curriculum

#### LEARN USING A CURRICULUM THAT FOCUSES ON WHAT YOU CAN DO IN THE LANGUAGE

Throughout the course, students complete mini-projects, and the final assessment is completed through a project determined by the instructor and student. Students are encouraged to pursue a project focusing not only on their new language abilities but also on their individual interests.

Whether they want to host a late-night show, sing a song, or write poetry in a new language, we motivate our students to challenge themselves and get creative.

#### **Enrolling and Matching with an Instructor**



#### **Starting Classes**

You can start classes any time of the year. Classes are scheduled at a time that works for you. You will also receive information to set up Microsoft Teams where all classes will happen.
